Charles D. Baker (R), Donald Berwick (D), Martha Coakley (D), Evan Falchuk (I), Mark Fisher (R),
Steven Grossman (D), Scott Lively (I), and Jeffrey McCormick (I).



Charles D. Baker (R)

A former Secretary of Administration and Finance under Governors Weld and Cellucci, Charlie Baker has acted as CEO of Harvard Pilgrim Health Care, and as an Entrepreneur in Residence at the venture capital firm General Catalyst Partners. He is a Republican candidate for governor.



Donald Berwick (D)

A pediatrician, executive and international leader, Don Berwick worked at Children's Hospital and the Harvard Community Health Plan and founded Institute for Healthcare Improvement. He is a Democrat candidate for governor.



Martha Coakley (D)

A native of Berkshire County in Western Massachusetts, Coakley has charted a career as a distinguished prosecutor before serving as Middlesex District Attorney and now as the Commonwealth's first female Attorney General. She is seeking the Democratic nomination for governor.



Evan Falchuk (I)

Falchuk is a successful entrepreneur, having served for 13 years on the executive leadership team of Boston-based global health care company Best Doctors, Inc. He is a United Independent Party candidate for governor.



Mark Fisher (R)

A small business owner, Fisher owns a metal manufacturing facility in Auburn, MA, having worked earlier in his career with Raytheon among other firms. He is a member of the Tea Party seeking the Republican nomination for governor.



Steven Grossman (D)

Steve Grossman is a small business owner of a fourth generation family company. He was the chairman of the Massachusetts Democratic Party and National Party Chair under President Bill Clinton. He is running as a Democratic candidate for governor.



Scott Lively (I)

As a lawyer, Lively launched a dispute resolution center, law partnership and a non-profit public interest firm in Southern California. A full-time minister since 2008, Lively is running for governor as a United Independent Party candidate.



Jeffrey McCormick (I)

Jeff McCormick founded Saturn Partners in 1993, financing and growing early stage companies including Boston Duck Tours, Twin Rivers Technologies biodiesel company in Quincy, and e-marketing firm Constant Contact in Waltham. He is a United Independent Party candidate for governor.
